Worthington Owen takes lead in Liverpool

The last time an agency other than CBRE occupied top position in the Liverpool office disposals league table, Mo Farah and Jessica Ennis Hill were gearing up to storm the London Olympics. But eight years later, having come within touching distance of 50 deals, Worthington Owen has won the gold medal in 2020.

The company was disposing agent in eight of the 10 largest deals of the past 12 months, according to Radius Data Exchange, with stand-out lettings including joint deals with CBRE at Canmoor's 20 Chapel Street to Park Group (25,982 sq ft) and just over 20,000 sq ft to Onward Homes at the Watson Building.

Worthington Owen was also involved in the largest deal, 65,000 sq ft at Echo Place to Sony Interactive. The joint agent was Glasgow-based Paradigm Property Consultants, which enters the Liverpool league table for the first time in fourth position courtesy of this sole deal.

Keppie Massie maintained third position thanks to disposing of 14,000 sq ft more than in the previous 12 months.

Despite both dropping two places, there are some positives for Avison Young and Hitchcock Wright & Partners. Avison Young saw total space disposed rise by almost 80%. Its two biggest deals were both at 1 Tithebarn Street, to DBS (18,473 sq ft) and Carpenters Solicitors (16,017 sq ft), alongside Worthington Owen. Hitchcock Wright & Partners saw an

increase in deal numbers of almost 30% year-on-year.

The total number of deals is at a similar level to last year. But the effects of Covid-19 are starting to be seen in the Liverpool office market. Just 15 of the 125 deals were signed off in the three months to the end of April. If this pattern continues, next year's league table will have a very different look indeed.

Going up



It has been an excellent 12 months for **Worthington Owen**, which finished top for the first time and completed the largest number of deals (49) in its five-year history.

After two years in a row of declining space disposed, things look on the up for **Matthews & Goodman**. The company is at its highest finish since 2017 and space disposed was up more than 200% compared to last year.

Going down



Both deal numbers and space disposed are at the lowest levels in recent memory for **CBRE**, so it is not surprising to see it knocked from its perch at the top of the table. It will certainly be looking to bounce back next year in testing conditions.
